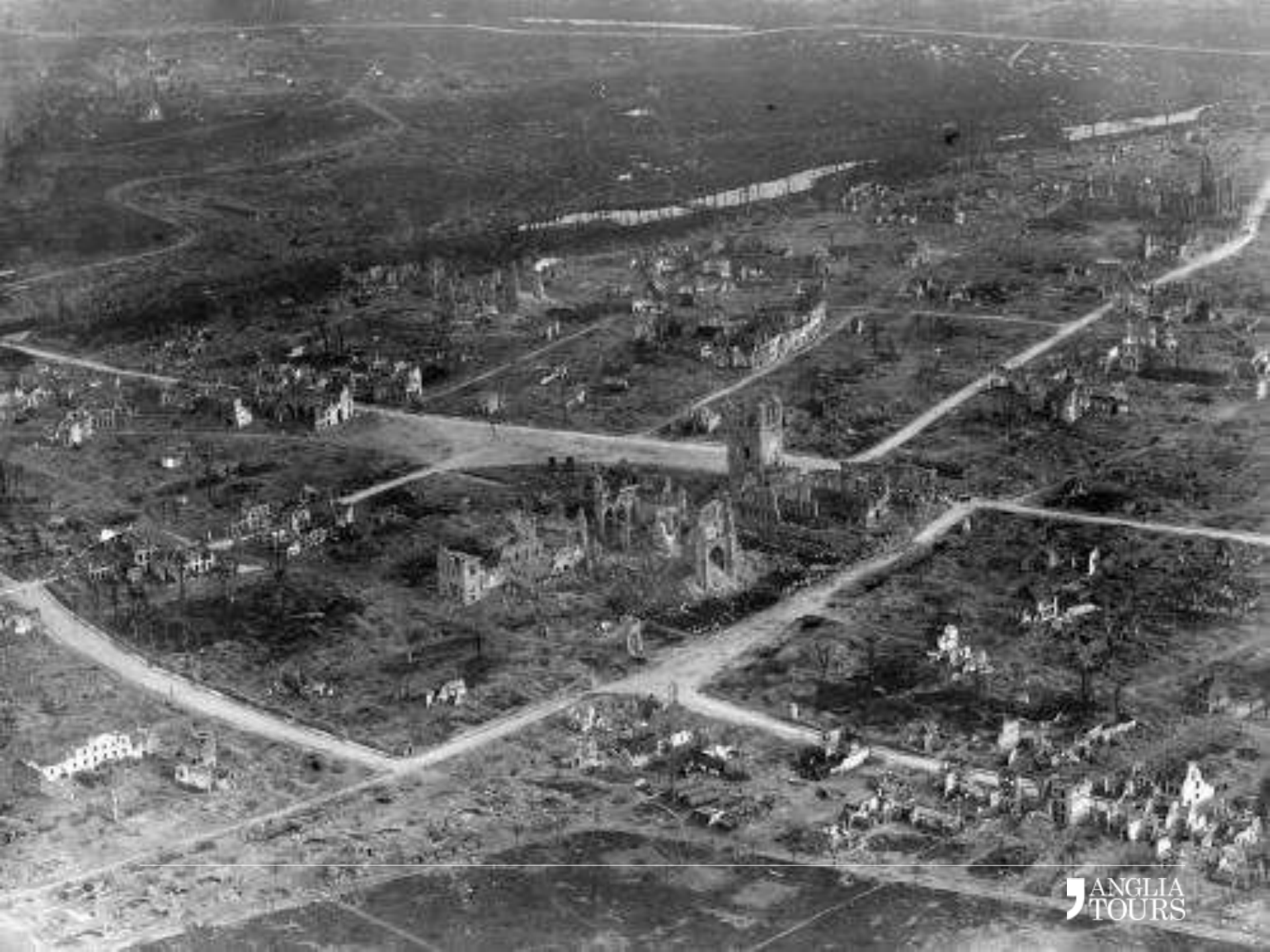




The Ypres Salient

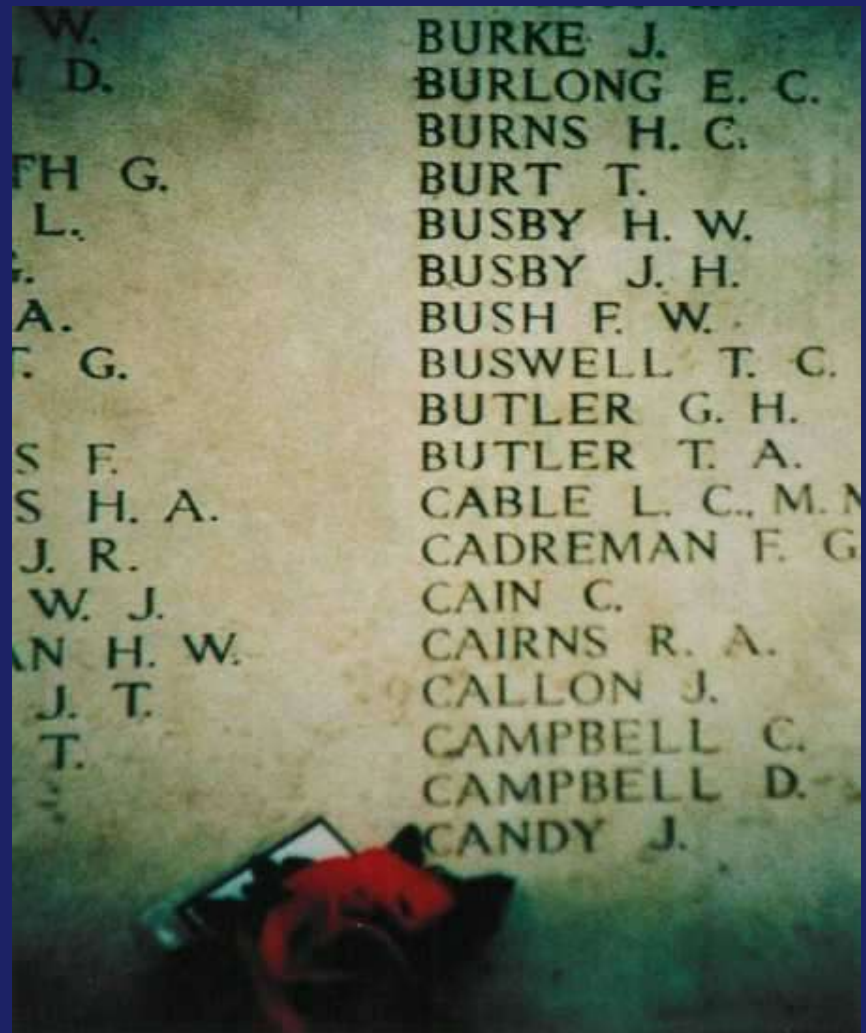

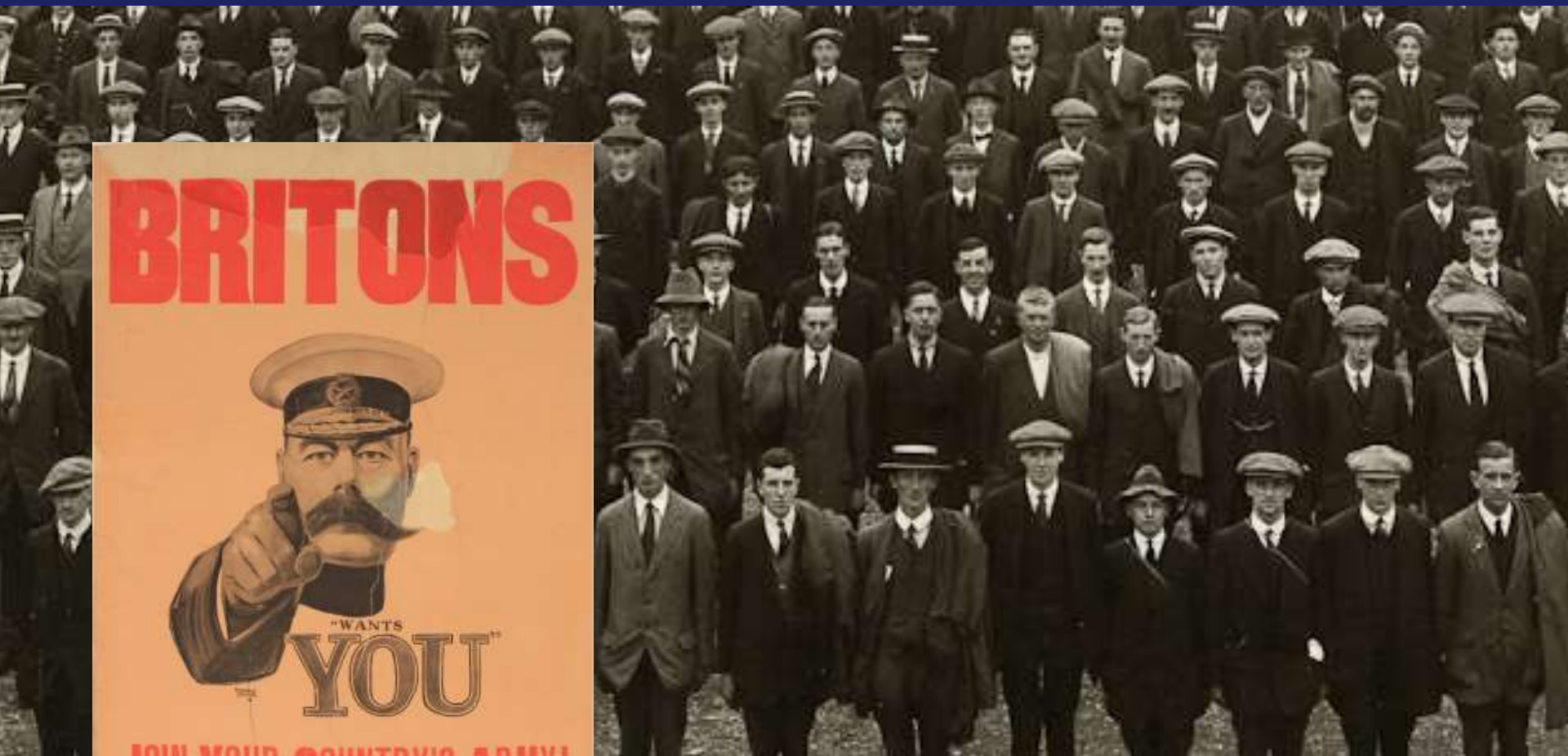

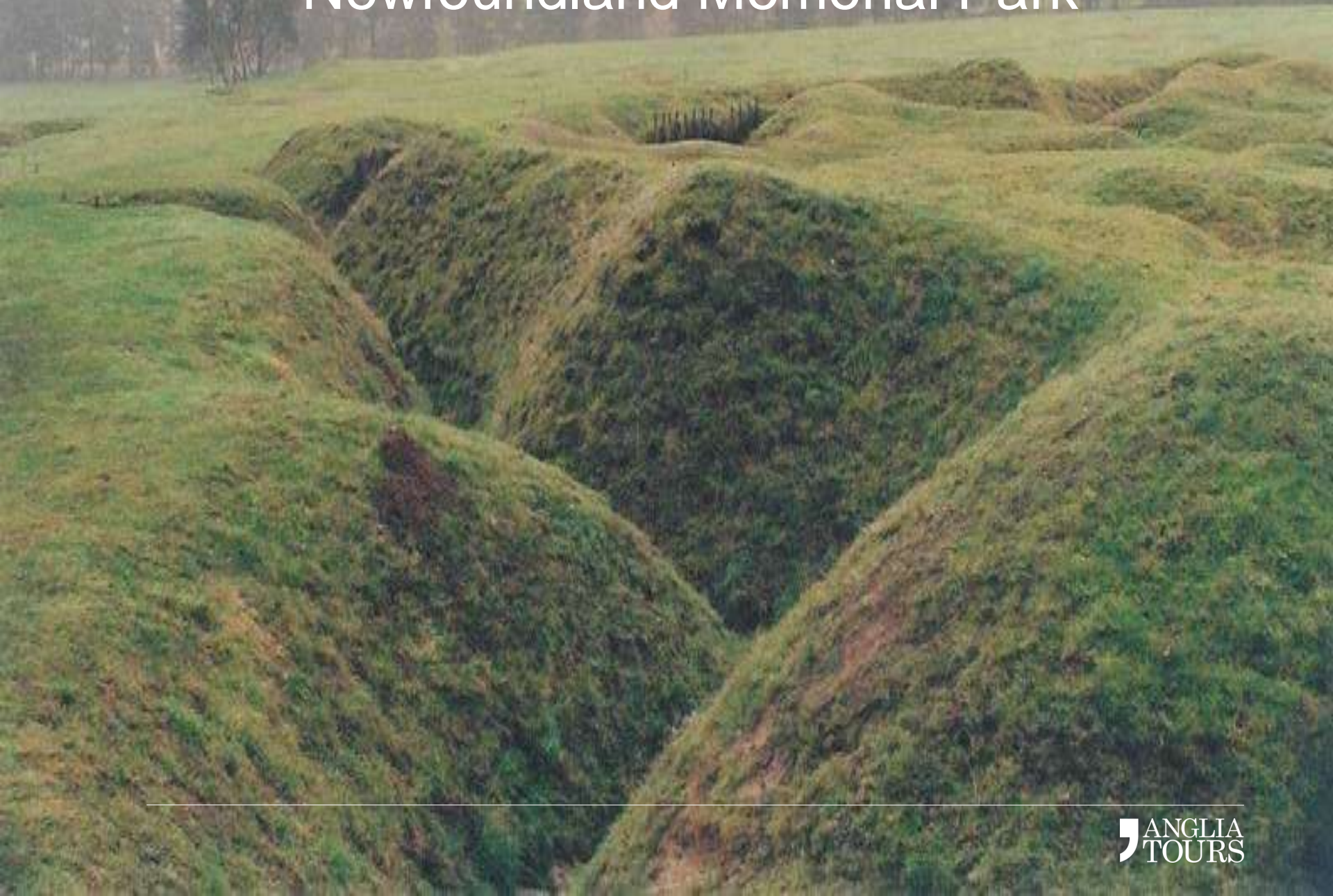

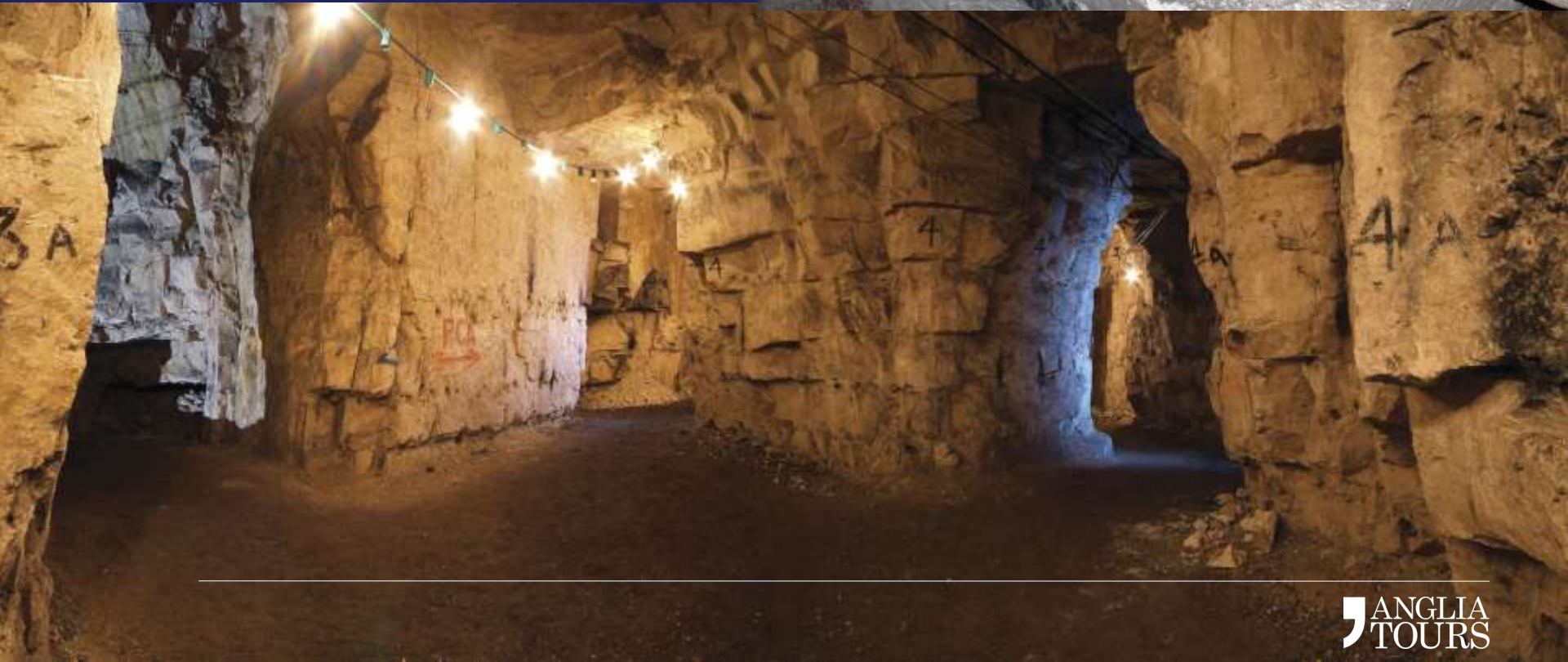
